

Don't forget we will be **closed Mon-day July 4th** in honor of Independence Day. Please stay safe and have fun with your family and friends!



Be sure to check out the class curriculum themes posted outside of your child's class to see what they will be learning about in the month of July.




We hope all of our Dad's enjoyed their special day. We certainly enjoyed seeing the dad's for our donuts with dad event.


brought in for your child for water day and remember to pack a

upcoming VPK and Alumni


Wow, we cannot believe summer is already half over! This heat has really been something else this year.

Did You Know?

July is the seventh month of the year in both the Julian and Gregorian calendars. It was named by the Roman Senate in honor of Roman general Julius Cæsar because it was his birth month.

July 18: Nelson Mandela International Day. Nelson Mandela International Day, or Mandela Day, was created in 2009 by the United Nations and first celebrated in 2010. It's a day to honor the legacy of Nelson Mandela and his values through volunteering and community service.

July 01: American Zoo Day

American Zoo Day commemorates the grand opening of Philadelphia Zoo, America's first zoo, on July 1, 1874.

The charter establishing the Zoological Society of Philadelphia was signed in 1859, but due to the Civil War, it was another 15 years before the zoo opened.

That first year there were 813 animals and over 228,000 visitors. Today, there are over 1,300 animals—many of them rare and endangered—and there are more than 1.2 million visitors annually

July 03: Plastic Bag Free Day

Plastic Bag Free Day, sometimes referred to as International Plastic Bag Free Day, is a global initiative aimed at eliminating the use of single-use plastic bags around the world. Created in 2011* by Zero Waste Europe, it's now part of a larger Break Free From Plastic campaign.

According to Zero Waste Europe:

- Depending on the type of plastic, it takes between 100 to 500 years for a plastic bag to disintegrate.
- 1 million plastic bags are used around the world every minute.
- 80% of marine litter is plastic.
